The Legacy of Gertrude Lundberg

1915–1996

Glenview resident, Gertrude Wiersema “Billie” Lundberg, worked as a registered nurse, scout and YMCA leader, and a professional genealogist during her long, productive life.

Billie became interested in genealogy in the 1940s when she and her husband, Bernhard Jr., began collecting genealogical and historical materials. Cemetery cataloging was a favorite activity of hers. She researched family histories for friends and a number of prominent people, including the founding families of Glenview.

In 1965, Billie began researching her own family tree, a task that took her to the Netherlands. In 1970, she co-founded the South Suburban Genealogical Society with friend and fellow genealogist, Ira Bishop, of Homewood, Illinois. Over the years, Billie authored numerous articles and books on specific family histories.

Billie cataloged genealogy books and periodicals for the Glenview Public Library and taught Glenview librarians how to help patrons conduct genealogy searches. In 1970, Billie participated in the project to automate the circulation records of the Glenview, Arlington Heights, and Mount Prospect Public Libraries.

Mrs. Lundberg's legacy, the **Lundberg Collection**, is a rare local genealogical resource. The treasured collection includes more than 350 books, 300 issues of 60 periodicals, original genealogies, local histories and microfilm donated to the Glenview Public Library by Mrs. Gertrude Lundberg and her family, who were also professional genealogists.

Using the Lundberg Collection

To use the valuable, locked-case Lundberg resources, please leave a library card or ID with a reference librarian. To see a list of titles and call numbers in the **Lundberg Collection**, search the Glenview Public Library catalog under the subject heading **Lundberg Collection**, or by author, title, or keyword of specific books. Collection resources span the nation and date from various centuries, with primary emphasis on Illinois. Information on the majority of Glenview residents before 1900 is stored in the **Lundberg Collection**, which also includes magazines from various genealogical societies, 40 books on Chicago's history, and many more important local resources.
